## Code of Conduct For Cycling Trip

- 1. Common sense is your best guide, we don't want reams of rules, if you think about your behaviour, you know what is right & wrong.
- 2. To be courteous & polite are foundations of all good behaviour, especially when you are an ambassador of your school.
- 3. Instructions must be followed without argument or challenge.
- 4. A front marker will be set in the group, you are not allowed to cycle past this person.
- 5. The rear marker is there to assist you with problems.
- 6. Show courtesy to other users of the cycle route.
- 7. Cycle on the left when passing other bicycles.
- 8. Cycle in a way which enables you to retain control of your bike at all times to look after yourself & other users of the trail.
